Baseball Newfoundland and Labrador held its Workshops and Annual General Meeting from November 21st – 23rd, 2025 at the Quality Inn and Suites in Gander.

Registration numbers once again increased and, for the first time in history, eclipsed 4,000 players province-wide. Female baseball once again maintains a strong place in the province, with nearly 22% of registration coming from female baseball players. The growth of the female game, coupled with the 2025 Canada Summer Games and female baseball's inclusion for the first time, will be exciting for the continued growth and development moving into the future.

Membership also had the opportunity to come together throughout the weekend and participate in five baseball-specific workshops – coaching and umpiring, minor baseball, female baseball, high-performance programming and a future in baseball planning session – to help frame the direction and focus of these areas moving into the future. These workshops were a great opportunity to engage member association, key stakeholders, provincial baseball leaders, parents, and volunteers about the direction of the sport moving into 2026 and beyond.

Additionally, attendees were provided the opportunity to participate in a Safe Sport workshop offered by Sport Newfoundland and Labrador. In the current sports landscape, Safe Sport has become critically important in today's culture and environment. The opportunity to engage and learn on this topic was fantastic, and provided attendees a way to learn how to continue to offer sports programming in a safe, inclusive and fun space.
